Parties that have competed as part of various electoral coalitions are highlighted in color.
- Only those parties are included that have crossed the electoral threshold for representation. In the 1999, 2003 and 2004, the threshold stood at 7%, in 2008 at 5%.
- All elections were conducted according to a mixed electoral system. Recorded are the results of the party list vote.
- For the 2003 elections the official results as announced by the Central Election Commission are recorded. After the Rose Revolution, these results were annulled, and repeat election were held in March 2004. Data on the annulled 2003 election have been included to demonstrate the changes between the 2003 election and the 2004 repeat elections.
